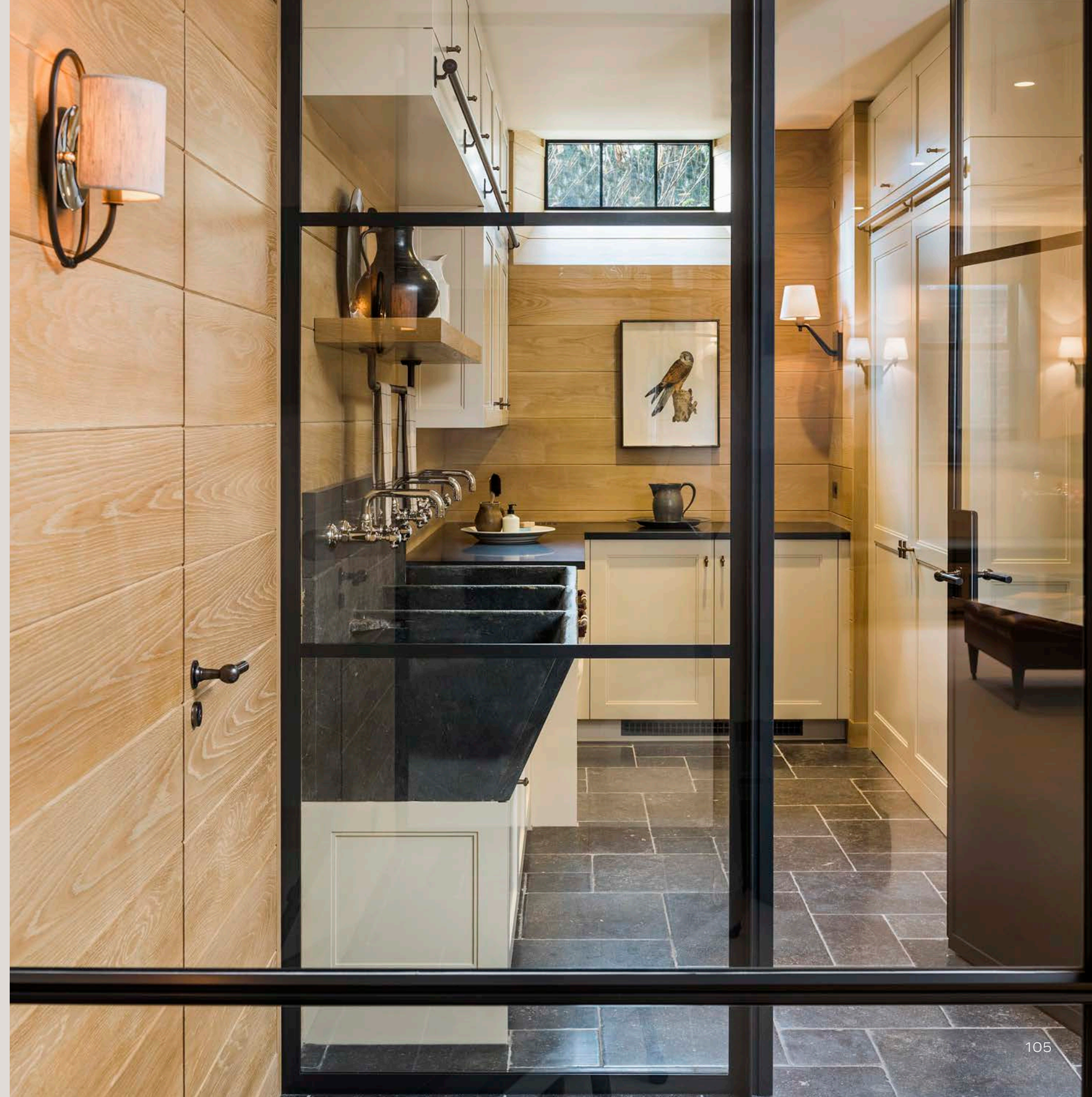






We all get a lot of juice out of deciding that we can build anything. If we don't know how to build it right now, we'll learn, and then build it.
